Purpose

- Analyze poetry for meaning, tone, and purpose
- Clarify key elements of both works; make text-to-text connections
- Stimulate interest and engagement

- Use song lyrics and (cited) passages from the play to answer the questions
- Explain your reasoning by quoting and citing key lines and phrases
- Use website audio player to answer Music Analysis

Key

V1 = Verse 1

B1 = Bridge 1

C1 = Chorus 1

L1 = Line 1

R1 = Reprise 1

1. Foreshadowing

- According to V1 of “The Jubilee Of Juliet, Part 1,” what’s one thing we can expect to happen in *Romeo & Juliet*?
- Which line(s) from *Romeo & Juliet*’s Prologue best support(s) this prediction?
- Which lines does V1 echo more: (1.5.62-64) or (3.1.1-4)? Explain.
- How would you define foreshadowing, and how does it work to create interest or suspense?
- Which line(s) from B1 are an example of foreshadowing? Explain.
- Which is a better example of foreshadowing: V3 or C1? What objects, elements, characters or phrases create a sense of things to come? And what do these lines suggest we can expect? Explain.
- Which is a better example of foreshadowing: B2 or C2? What objects, elements, characters or phrases create a sense of things to come? And what do these lines suggest we can expect? Explain.
- How is “The Jubilee of Juliet, Part 1” similar to The Prologue of *Romeo & Juliet*? Can you find any common phrases? What are the common themes?

2. Imagery, Symbolism & Metaphor

- a) Shakespeare created certain characters that symbolize or represent a certain attitude, feeling or quality. According to V2, what does Tybalt represent? Explain.
- b) Which lines from Act 1 better support this characterization: (1.1.68-70) or (1.5.62-64)? Explain.
- c) What does “the rain” represent in B1?
- d) What does “the worship’d sun” represent in B1?
- e) Which of Romeo’s lines does B1 more closely paraphrase: (1.5.45-54) or (2.2.1-10)? Explain.
- f) Who are Ares and Mars as referred to in C2?
- g) What might it mean for Ares and Mars to “write the final page?”

3. Character Analysis: Romeo

- a) When we first meet Romeo in “The Jubilee Of Juliet, Part 1,” how is he feeling?
- b) Which lines from Act 1 give a more detailed explanation as to why he’s feeling this way: (1.1.161-167) or (1.1.198-215)? Explain.

4. Close Reading

- a) Why does Friar Laurence marry Romeo & Juliet?
- b) Which lines from Act 2 better support your answer: (2.3.65-68) or (2.3.89-92)? Explain.

5. Poetic Techniques

- a) Define rhyme, assonance and alliteration.
- b) What poetic technique(s) does V1.L1 employ?
- c) What poetic techniques(s) does V2 employ?
- d) Identify the assonant phrases in the following lines: (V4,L2), (V5,L1), (V5,L2), (V5,L4), (C2,L2)

6. Music Analysis

- a) What instruments can you identify in V1?
- b) What parts of the drums does the drummer hit in V1?
- c) How would you characterize the tone of V1? What feelings or emotions does it elicit?
- d) What instrument enters in V2?
- e) How do the drums pick up from V1 to V2? What's the drummer hitting in V2 that he wasn't hitting in V1?
- f) How do the drums pick up from V2 to V3? What's the drummer hitting in V3 that he wasn't hitting in V2?
- g) What feeling or effect does the music create in moving from V1 to V2 to V3?
- h) Listen for the reverb-soaked guitar notes in B1 (1:10-1:27); who or what do you suppose those notes are supposed to symbolize or represent?
- i) How would you characterize the feeling or tone of B1?
- j) Listen closely to the guitar solo (4:04-4:40); try to pick out the 3 different lead guitar parts. Can you hear them?
- k) First focus on the 2 reverb-soaked, clean-sounding guitars playing a harmony lead. Let's say they represent Romeo and Juliet. What do they seem to be feeling? If they were speaking words, what might they be saying?
- l) Now pick out the more distorted guitar lead "between" the 2 harmony leads. If the harmony leads symbolize Romeo & Juliet, what might the distorted guitar in the middle represent?
